Anyone may obtain a copy at [LGCNHSSECURITY@lancastergeneralcollege.edu](mailto:LGCNHSSECURITY@lancastergeneralcollege.edu) Statistics in this report are obtained from the incident reports of the College Security, incident reports of local law enforcement agencies and information from other campus officials designated by this Act as Campus Security Authorities.

Campus Security Authorities include but are not limited to: faculty advisors to registered student organizations, Deans, Vice Presidents, Pastoral and professional counselors or President of the College. Pastoral and professional counselors are exempt from reporting, but are encouraged to have victims report crimes for a minimum of inclusion of the statistical report.

### ***You are the key to your own safety and the safety of others in the Lancaster General College of Nursing and Health Sciences Community.***

**1. BE ALERT.** Your safety depends mostly upon your own attitude and actions. Use common sense and do not place yourself in a location or situation to become a victim of crime.

**2. IF YOU OBSERVE ANY SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY OR WISH TO REPORT ANY CRIMINAL ACT, CALL THE COLLEGE SECURITY DEPARTMENT IMMEDIATELY AT 544-1159.** For police, fire or medical emergencies, you may contact College Security by calling 41159 from any campus phone or 544-1159 from an off-campus phone or on campus payphone. You may also use any of the emergency call boxes throughout the campus. Simply push the button, or follow the instructions on the phone, to be in direct contact with College Security. The campus community is encouraged to report all crimes and safety-related incidents to the College Security Department as quickly as possible.

**3. IF YOU BECOME AWARE OF A CRIME, OBSERVE A SUSPICIOUS PERSON OR SITUATION OR ARE A VICTIM YOURSELF, PROMPTLY REPORT IT TO THE POLICE AND COLLEGE SECURITY.**

Timely reports increase the likelihood that critical evidence will be obtained, stolen property will be recovered and the offender will be successfully prosecuted. This is especially important in cases involving sex offenses. A prompt report to the police or college security will also ensure that you are made aware of all available victim support services.

**4. AVOID WALKING ALONE AT NIGHT.** Make arrangements to walk in groups and, whenever possible, use the College Shuttle to and from the parking area to the college or hospital. Hours of operation for the College Shuttle may be obtained by calling (717) 715 - 3463. If you must travel alone at night, stay on well-lit paths and sidewalks.

**5. KEEP YOUR ROOM DOOR LOCKED AT ALL TIMES.** Locking your door with your key, *wherever* you reside, is an effective way to reduce theft and enhance personal safety. The vast majority of thefts occur from unlocked rooms when the occupant is gone only briefly. Do not prop open exterior doors, and close any doors you find propped open. Propped doors are a high risk and greatly increase chances of your victimization. Do not open your door to someone you do not know.

**6. DO NOT LEND YOUR KEY OR KEYCARD TO ANYONE.** Your action could result in both you and /or an innocent victim being referred to the campus judicial system. Report a lost or stolen ID badge to Security and the Employee Service Center immediately.

**7. REPORT OBSCENE, ANNOYING, OR HARASSING PHONE CALLS OR E-MAIL MESSAGES IMMEDIATELY.** Security will investigate, and as patterns develop, they will work closely with the Local Police and the Telephone Company to apprehend offenders.

**8. PARK YOUR CAR IN WELL-LIT AREAS AND KEEP IT LOCKED.** Lock all valuables in your trunk.

**9. REGISTER YOUR BICYCLE WITH YOUR LOCAL POLICE.** They will issue a registration sticker to affix to your bicycle to deter theft and aid in recovery if it is stolen. College Security strongly recommends a U-style lock. A registered and properly locked bicycle is much less likely to be stolen.

**10. PARTICIPATE IN PERSONAL SAFETY AND SECURITY AWARENESS PROGRAMS.** The College Security Department frequently conducts programs that promote crime resistance skills. Rape Aggression Defense (RAD) is a personal defense course offered to women through the YWCA. For information on RAD or other programs, please Call College Security at x41159.

**11. BE AWARE OF CAMPUS CRIME TRENDS.** Information on campus crime is available from the College Security. Statistics on crime reported to the College Security for the most recent three-year period are shown on the next page.

**HATE CRIMES** = Hate crimes are those crimes that manifest evidence that the victim was intentionally selected because of the perpetrator's bias. Hate crimes are reported for the following crimes: Murder, Non-negligent Manslaughter, Negligent Manslaughter, Forcible Sex Offenses, Non-Forcible Sex Offenses, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Motor Vehicle Theft, Arson, Larceny-Theft, Simple Assault,

**Public Property** = Any public property within the campus, immediately adjacent to the campus or accessible from the campus.

**Other Campus Officials** = College Officials who have significant responsibility for student and campus activities. Crimes reported to these officials and referrals(Arrest and Referrals Chart) to Judicial Hearing are listed under this category. Clergy, physicians and counselors are exempt from this reporting requirement.

**Local Law Enforcement** = Police agencies that have authority in the areas surrounding the campus or on campus when necessary. These agencies include, but are not limited to, the Lancaster City Police Department, Lancaster County Sheriff, Alcohol Law Enforcement, State Police and State Bureau of Investigation.

**Arrests** = The physical arrest or issuing of a citation to a person accused of violating state law.

**Referred for Disciplinary Action** = The referral of a student who has violated state law or College Policy to the Dean of Enrollment for disciplinary action.

#### **HATE CRIMES** *by Category*

*(1) These figures are included in the On-Campus numbers.*

*(2) Includes larcenies where the legal access to the building by the perpetrator is unknown.*

Intimidation, Destruction/damage/vandalism of property, and any other crime involving bodily injury. No hate crimes were reported to the LGC Security during 2006, 2007, or 2008.

**ARREST & REFERRALS EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS, CRIME ALERTS AND ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE FROM THE COLLEGE SECURITY DEPARTMENT** The College Security Department offers an extensive series of educational and personal safety programs to the College and local communities designed to inform them about the prevention of crimes.

The College Security Department provide informational programs to inform the campus community about campus security procedures and practices and fire safety beginning with Freshman Orientation because it is very important to be aware of any threat.

Students and employees must exercise responsibility for their own safety. Customized programs on most security related topics such as Workplace Violence are prepared for campus groups and organizations upon request.

College Security is present at new employee orientation. College Security presented to over 400 people during the year.

Counseling Programs are also available on campus as well as off campus.

In an effort to provide timely notice to the Lancaster General College community, and in the event of a serious incident which may pose an on-going threat to members of the Lancaster General College community, a blast email Crime Alert is sent to all students and employees on campus. The alerts are generally written by the Lead Security officer or a designee and they are approved and distributed to the community by the College Administration.

Updates to the community about any particular case resulting in a Crime Alert may be distributed via blast email and/or may be posted on the College Security web site.

Crime Alerts are usually distributed for the following Uniformed Crime Reporting Program (UCR)/National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) classifications: arson, criminal homicide, first degree burglary and robbery. Cases of aggravated assault and sex offenses are considered on a case-by-case basis, depending on the facts of the case and the information known by College Security. For example, if an assault occurs between two students who have a disagreement, there may be no on-going threat to other Lancaster General College community members and a Crime Alert would not be distributed. The Lead Security officer or designee reviews all reports to determine if there is an on-going threat to the community and the distribution of a Crime Alert is warranted.

**MONITORING CRIMES AT OFF-CAMPUS ORGANIZATIONS:** - No off-campus student organization is recognized by the College at this time. (Such as Greek sorties or fraternities.)

**COLLEGE SECURITY:** The Lancaster General College Security Department is comprised of professional personnel whose purpose is to provide a safe environment in which students and employees may learn and work. The professionally-trained department consists of security officers, and support staff who often work with local, state, and federal agencies, to resolve cases.

The primary concern of the Department is to protect and assist the campus community. It operates from 0600 to 2300 hrs Monday through Friday. When College Security staff is not on duty, members of the Lancaster General Hospital Security Department cover security related items at the college. The Lancaster General Hospital Security staff work 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, watching for circumstances that threaten the campus and taking appropriate action.

The Hospital Communications Center also operates 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. When reporting a crime or emergency, call 77911 from any in house phone. When calling from an off-campus phone, cell phone or using an on-campus pay phone, dial 544 - 5117. In response to a call, Hospital Communications Center will take the required action, dispatching an officer, and when necessary Local Law Enforcement. The Communications Center also has radio contact with all area emergency services.

**When you observe a crime or emergency, call 911 immediately.**

College Security Officers are not fully sworn police officers under the laws of the Pennsylvania. They do not have full arrest powers on College property and property adjacent to the College. Local Law enforcement will be called for any issues where they are needed.

Police incident reports are forwarded to Dean of Enrollment for potential action, as appropriate. A Local Police Detective will investigate a report when it is deemed appropriate. Additional information obtained via the investigation will also be forwarded to the Den of Enrollment.

Lancaster General, Employee and Student Health Services are available to any victim of a crime.

The College Security works closely with Local and State law enforcement agencies. The College Security maintains a Mutual Aid Agreement, under the laws of Pennsylvania, with the Lancaster City Police Department. This agreement allows each department to provide assistance to the other when necessary.

The College has 2 blue light call boxes on campus. Anyone using a callbox is directly connected to the Hospital Communications Center. Security Officers are dispatched to an activated call box.

Call boxes and campus lighting are routinely checked by College Security Officers and repair requests are made to College Facilities Management.

Crimes should be reported to the College Security to ensure inclusion in the annual crime statistics and to aid in providing timely warning notices to the community.

Additionally students may report crimes to individuals designated by the Clery Act as Campus Security Authorities. Campus Security Authorities include but are not limited to: faculty advisors to registered student organizations, Deans, Vice Presidents for Student Life, Directors of Student Development,

Campus Security Authorities are to provide statistics and location (to avoid double reporting) information for inclusion in the annual crime statistics to College Security.

### **COLLEGE POLICY ON VIOLATION OF ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE LAWS:**

Intoxication, public consumption or public displays of alcoholic liquors, wines or beer on campus is prohibited, except as described within the College Alcohol Policy. All persons on campus are subject to state and federal regulations concerning the use of alcohol.

Public display is defined as the possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages in any public or unregistered area of campus.

Consumption of alcohol by anyone less than 21 years of age is a violation of state law.

Use, possession, manufacture, sale, distribution, and transportation of illegal drugs and drug paraphernalia are prohibited. Students found to be involved in illegal drugs, either on or off-campus will be subject to disciplinary action, which may include dismissal from the College, and parents will be notified.

College Security enforces both state law and College policy and individuals may be arrested for violating the law regarding the unlawful possession, use and sale of alcohol and drugs.

**ACCESSIBILITY TO COLLEGE PROPERTY AND BUILDINGS:** There is one entrance to the Main College building at 410 N. Lime St. (This entrance is off of Spruce St.) Access to the college can be gained by use of Card Key access from 0530 to 0700 hrs. and again from 1900 hrs to 2300 hrs. From 0700 hrs to 1900 hrs the college main door is unlocked (but College photo ID must be presented to gain access.) This entrance is staffed by College Security officers from 0600 to 2300 Monday through Friday. Access

to the buildings for weekends is via card key access from 0600 to 1700 hrs. Individual rooms are accessible by key. With the exception of the computer rooms that are accessible by card key only.

Administrative Office at 549 N. Lime St. is open from 0700 to 1700 Monday through Friday with summer hours of 0700 to 1630 hrs. No Weekend or Holiday access is permitted.

Faculty offices located at 430 to 434 N. Lime St. are accessible via card key only from 0600 to 1900 Monday to Friday. No Weekend or Holiday access is permitted.

**VICTIM COUNSELING:** The Employee and Student Health office, also offers short-term individual counseling to students to help with victimization and a wide variety of other issues including adjustment to college life. Referrals are also available. All services from this department are confidential and FREE to students.

The Employee and Student Health office is located in the downtown pavilion of the Lancaster General Hospital. Located at, 555 N. Duke St. It is located on the 1<sup>st</sup> floor of the pavilion on the East side. The Office is open from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. weekdays. After-hour emergency counseling is available through the Emergency Department of Lancaster General Hospital and Pastoral Services.

**SEXUAL ASSAULT:** The College takes a very strong stand on the issue of sexual assault. College guidelines state: "The College will vigorously address instances of sexual misconduct and will endeavor to preserve a victim's confidentiality." At Lancaster General College of Nursing and Health Sciences, the sanctions may include, but are not limited to, expulsion and referral of any evidence to civil authorities for criminal prosecution.

Both Men and Women on campus should consider taking a self-defense course.

1. If you become a victim of sexual assault: **Call 911**

Remember, it's not your fault, regardless of the circumstances. No one asks or deserves to be raped or assaulted!

2. Report the incident to College Security. For your own protection and that of the community, it is important to notify College Security on campus – 41159; off campus– 544 - 1159. Timely reports increase the likelihood that critical evidence will be obtained (do not wash your clothing). If you decide to file legal charges, the College Security Department can advise you on how to proceed.

You may file criminal charges; refer the case to the campus Judicial System, or both.

In either case, both the victim and the accused have the right to have others at the hearing and be informed of the outcome.

The College Security Department will provide Numbers to local Victims' Assistants Group(s) who are trained to help you through every step from the crime scene to court and obtaining on or off-campus counseling.

3. Seek immediate support. Call or tell a close friend, a roommate, a family member, or someone else what has happened. This is not the time to be alone!

4. Get immediate medical help. Contact the Employee and Student Health Service (544-5354) or a local hospital. It is crucial that you seek medical attention as soon as possible. Having an Evidence Collection Kit completed at a local hospital within 72 hours will assist an investigation, should you decide now (or later) that you want to prosecute. You must also determine the possibilities of physical injury, sexually transmitted diseases or pregnancy. Emergency room personnel at both local hospitals are trained to respond sensitively to victims of rape and sexual assault.

5. Contact the Employee and Student Health Service. If you want and need a safe and confidential place to talk about what has happened, call (544-5354), or visit the Counseling Center which offers individual counseling and a support group for women who have been raped or sexually assaulted. Your confidentiality will be protected at all times. **CHANGE IN VICTIM'S ACADEMIC SITUATION:** The College will make every effort to make changes in a victim's academic situation if requested and reasonably available. Changes in an academic situation should be made through the Register's office with the Dean of Enrollment's involvement.

**CAMPUS DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS:** Although responsibility rests upon the student for his or her own conduct, the Board of Trustees has specifically charged the faculty and administration with the responsibility of prescribing requirements for the orderly behavior and government of all students. The College judicial system is administered by the Dean of Enrollment, The Board of Trustees has empowered the president with the authority to suspend students from the College in "cases of clear and present danger to lives and property...and in instances of violence to persons..." Other sanctions may include the following:

**Alcohol violations** – fines, alcohol education and community service hours.

**Fire safety violations** – cancellation of housing contract or other sanction;

**Controlled substance violation** –suspension or expulsion, miscellaneous other service, fines,

**MISSING STUDENT PROCEDURE: - Lancaster General College does not have** Students residing in on-campus housing. But Students may register a confidential contact with Dean of Enrollment, **available October 2010**. The registration is optional and the contact name will only be accessed and contacted if a student is officially determined to be missing for 24hours. The confidential contact should be someone who will be likely to know your location and you wish contacted if you are missing.

The confidential contact information will be accessible only to authorized campus officials and law enforcement personnel. If anyone believes that a resident student is missing they should immediately contact the Lancaster General College Security Department at 41159 from an on campus phone or 717 – 544 -1159 from a cell phone.

College Security will begin an investigation and notify Local Police. If Lancaster General College Security Department determines that the student is missing for 24 hours they will contact the student's registered confidential contact and also notify the local Police. If the student is under 18 years of age and is not emancipated, Lancaster General College Security Department will notify the student's parents or legal guardian.

**EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION OF IMMEDIATE THREAT:** In the event that an emergency or dangerous situation involving an immediate threat to the health and safety of students or staff exists on campus contact College Security. After confirmation of the emergency by College Security, officers on scene will activate all or part of the Lancaster General College of Nursing and Health Sciences, Emergency Operations Plan, to notify the community.

LGC Alert has two components for emergency notification; Mass / burst E-mail and door to door notification on campus. Notification would not occur if, in the judgment of the authorities, efforts to assist a victim, contain, or respond to the emergency would be compromised.

During unusual or changing situations College Security Communicators may type or speak messages into the systems. The content of these messages may be composed by the Security Officer on duty, the Crisis Management Team, Hospital Communications, senior College administration, or a combination of these groups.

Annually each system will be tested with prior notice to the College community.

Results of the testing will be documented. Additional tests may be conducted if deemed necessary. During an emergency, follow-up messages may come from one or all of the alert systems depending on the situation.

Outside the College, neighborhood associations will be contacted so they may inform their members.

**FIRE SAFETY:** Fire drills will be performed 2 times a year.

### 1. Steps for reporting a fire

- A. Activate the fire alarm/pull station.
- B. Evacuate the building.
- C. Call College Security at 544 - 1159 and provide the following information:
  - i. Your name
  - ii. Your building, location of fire, nature of fire. Inform officials of any students unable to evacuate.
- D. Go to your evacuation area so LGC staff will know you evacuated.
- E. Wait for further instructions from emergency personnel or LGC staff.

### 2. Fire Extinguisher Use

- a. At no time should you risk your own safety by attempting to extinguish a fire or to return to a burning building!
- b. Be familiar with the location and proper methods for using the extinguishers in your building and where they are located.

### 3. Fire Incident Report

- a. All fires (active or extinguished) and false alarms must be reported to the College Security Department at 544 - 1159. College Security and the local Fire Department will be dispatched.
- b. The Fire Department will assure that everything has been properly extinguished.

- i. The Security officer on duty will contact the College Facilities Manager immediately following a fire alarm.
- ii. Reports are to be completed and returned by the responding Security member within 24 hours following the incident.

#### 4. Fire Safety

Be thoroughly familiar with your building, the fire lanes around your building, Fire Safety equipment, and emergency procedures. Your attitude and knowledge towards fire safety helps create a safety conscious student body.

5. Fire Alarm and Sprinkler System Policies Giving false fire alarms or tampering with fire alarm or sprinkler equipment is an offense under state of Pennsylvania criminal law.

- a. "It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to want only and willfully give or cause to be given, or to advise, counsel, or aid and abet anyone in giving a false alarm of fire, or to break the glass key protector, or to pull the side arm, or lever of any station or signal box of any fire station, or willfully, misuse or damage a portable fire extinguisher or in any way to willfully interfere with, damage, deface, molest, or injure any part or portion of any fire alarm, fire detection, smoke detection, or fire extinguishing system."
- b. "Any person violating this statute or any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed five hundred dollars (\$500), imprisonment for not more than six months, or both." This is also punishable under Lancaster General College policy. The minimum / mandatory penalty under the College judicial system is the immediate cancellation of the student's Housing Agreement, without refund of fees paid.

Students, staff, and faculty should take special precautions to avoid tampering with, molesting, or accidentally activating the building sprinkler or smoke detection system. For example, sprinkler heads should not be used as a way to hang items in the classrooms. Students, staff or faculty may be held liable for damages that occur in rooms/common areas and/or be required to pay a Lancaster City citation as a result of sprinkler or smoke detection system activation or tampering. The College typically receives a citation for all false activations of the fire alarm systems which result in a monetary system fine on a tiered cost schedule.

c. The city of Lancaster Fire Code requires that nothing may be placed within 18 inches of any sprinkler head, including in room closets if a sprinkler head is installed within it such as any personal items or furniture.

**ELECTRICAL EXTENSIONS POLICY FOR RESIDENCE HALLS & OFF CAMPUS HOUSING** – At this time LGC does not have any Residence halls or off campus housing.

**APPLIANCE POLICY FOR COLLEGE BUILDINGS:** In order to ensure maximum health and safety standards in college owned or operated buildings, several categories of electrical appliances have been established. All Electrical items being brought into the College or college owned or operated buildings must be inspected by the Facilities Manager or their designate.

They are:

- a. Appliances that may not be used or stored in college owned or operated buildings. These include toaster ovens, convection ovens, electric skillets, waffle or crepe pans, crock pots, hot plates, hamburger makers, space heaters, electric blankets, fog machines, extension cords. Unless the college has furnished the items and or the Facilities Manager has inspected and approved them.
- b. Appliances that may be used and stored in rooms. These include musical appliances, hair dryers, and fans.
- c. Appliances that may be stored in rooms and used in kitchens / cafeteria areas. These include coffee makers, George Foreman grills (and similar items), toasters, and hot pots of any kind.
- d. Refrigerators that meet College standards are permitted. As long as Facilities Manager has inspected and approved them.
- e. Overhead, or room, lights may be not covered with any material
- f. Only microwaves provided by the College may be used within rooms. Students, faculty, and staff, may not bring additional microwaves to campus.
- g. Though permitted for no more than 60 days, students, faculty, and staff, may install string lights so long as this is done without damage to College property.

Lights must be inspected by Facilities Management or designee prior to being hung or before use.

k. Students, faculty, and staff may not install string lights through the ceiling tiles, or grid because of potential damage. This is not permitted in any instance. Any violation of this will result in automatic removal and potential fines for damage caused.

This document provides basic information on fire prevention, fire drills, fire marshal inspections, appliance policy, electrical extension cord policy, fire evacuation policy, and flammable materials policy.

**Fire Drills:** In 2010 there was 1 scheduled fire drill.
