Course Number	Course Title	Course Objective
60069	A Nurses Guide to Pain Management	The purpose of this course is to help nurses — who spend more time with patients with pain than any other members of the healthcare team — to assume an active role in the team approach to pain management.
CE481	A Perfect Match	The goal of this program is to educate nurses about blood incompatibility errors and the evidence-based practices to prevent them.
CE142	ABCs of Emergency Burn Management	The goal of this program is to update nurses' ability to care for patients with burns.
CE346	Abdominal Trauma: A Major Cause of Morbidity and Mortality	The goal of this program is to provide nurses with information about the incidence, etiology, identification, and treatment of abdominal trauma.
CE551	Adolescent Drinking: The Sobering Facts About Teen Alcohol Use and Abuse	The purpose of this module is to provide nurses with an overview of adolescent alcohol abuse.
CE84	Alcoholism is the Hospitalized Patient	The goal of this program is to provide nurses with the skills necessary to identify alcoholism in their hospitalized patients and to intervene on their behalf.
CE146-60	An Orthopedic Emergency	The goal of this program is to enhance healthcare professionals' ability to detect those at risk for developing acute compartment syndrome and how to care for them.
CE286	Biological Weapons & Emergency Preparedness, Part I	The goal of this program is to familiarize nurses with bioterrorism and its implications for nursing care. Part 1 focuses on the history of bioterrorism, the nurse's role in recognizing symptoms produced by common bioterrorism agents, and information about anthrax and plague. Part 2 focuses on the RN's role in emergency preparedness and response and keys to recognizing and responding to botulism and smallpox.
CE287	Biological Weapons & Emergency Preparedness, Part II	The goal of this program is to familiarize nurses with nursing ramifications of bioterrorism. Part 1 explored the history of bioterrorism, nurses' roles in recognizing symptoms produced by a biological terrorist attack, and information about anthrax and plague. Part 2 discusses botulism and smallpox and the nurse's role in emergency preparedness in the event of an attack.
CE368	Chemical Weapons and Emergency Preparedness	The goal of this chapter is to familiarize nurses with chemical agents that can be used in a terrorist attacks.
CE185	Child Abuse	The goal of this program is to update nurses' ability to recognize and treat victims of child abuse.
CE276-60	Children In Pain	The goal of this program is to update nurses' knowledge of how to recognize, assess, and treat children experiencing pain.
CE490	Critical Blood Loss Demands Fluid Resuscitation to Fight Hypovolemic Shock	The purpose of this program is to inform nurses about trends in fluid resuscitation of patients in hypovolemic shock caused by blood loss.
CE296	Evidence Collection and Preservation in a Healthcare Setting	The goal of this program is to provide nurses with an overview of how to collect and preserve evidence during forensic examination in a healthcare setting.
CE538	Facing Limb Loss: Helping Patients to Regain Function	The purpose of this module is to provide nurses with information about caring for people who have limb loss.
CE151	Fall Prevention Among the Elderly	The goal of this program is to improve clinicians' ability to identify and minimize risk factors for falls in the elderly and understand the applicability of The Joint Commission's National Patient Safety Goal of reducing the risk of patient harm resulting from falls.
CE192	Forensic Nursing and Violent Schoolchildren	The goal of this program is to acquaint nurses with the specialty of forensic nursing and to describe how to use homicide classifications to identify school shooters.
CE100	Hand Trauma: Emergency Measures to Rehab	The goal of this program is to provide a review of the assessment and treatment of patients with hand trauma.
CE366	Hidden Danger: Venous Thromboembolism	The purpose of this program is to provide nurses with information about the risk factors for venous thromboembolism, its diagnosis, prevention, and treatment, and the potential for life-threatening complications.
60077	How Nurses Can Help Prevent Child Abuse	This course is designed for nurses who care for children in the community, ED, home, hospital, and outpatient settings. Its purpose is to increase nurses' knowledge and skills to detect child maltreatment. This course will further identify key nursing interventions to prevent, report, and treat child abuse.
60105	Insulin Management	The purpose of this course is to provide nurses with the principles of insulin dosage adjustment in order to increase their general understanding of insulin therapy. Descriptions and examples will illustrate the prospective and retrospective approaches, rationale for carbohydrate counting, and practical guidelines for using insulin analogs: lispro (Humalog), aspart (NovoLog), Glulisine (Apidra), Glargine (Lantus), and Detemir (Levemir).
60080	Meeting the Challenge of Pediatric Pain Management	The purpose of this course is to inform nurses about the historical difficulties surrounding pediatric pain management, propose pharmacologic and nonpharmacologic treatments, and discuss complexities involved in various pediatric pain management cases.
CE350	Nurses Can Help Older Drivers Steer Clear of Trouble	The goal of this program is to describe the nurse's role in the older driver's safe mobility.
CE404	Nurses Can Help Zap VAP	The goal of this program is to provide clinicians with information about ventilator-associated pneumonia (VAP): its prevalence, pathogenesis, risk factors, diagnosis, management, and prevention.
CE146	Orthopedic Emergency: Compartment Syndrome	The goal of this program is to enhance healthcare professionals' ability to detect those at risk for developing acute compartment syndrome and how to care for them.

60068	Preparing for Bioterrorism: Nurses on the Front Line	With the Sept. 11 attack on the World Trade Center and Pentagon and the subsequent anthrax attacks, Americans came to the realization that terrorists have the knowledge and capability to strike anywhere. No longer could we look at terrorism in other countries and feel confident that it wouldn't happen here in our own country. With this new reality came the recognition that we as health care workers need to know about the pathogens that are most likely to be used in a future attack and how best to respond if another attack ever occurs. This course provides a brief history of bioterrorism and identifies the six agents or classes of agents most likely to be used as weapons: anthrax, smallpox, pneumonic plague, botulinum toxin, tularemia, and viral hemorrhagic fevers. Familiarity with these agents will help health care workers recognize the features that can be used to distinguish an attack from a naturally occurring disease.
60052	Recognizing and Treating Five Shock States	The purpose of this course is to provide nurses with important information about shock and shock states, including cardiogenic, hypovolemic, anaphylactic, neurogenic, and septic shock. The pathophysiology, clinical signs and symptoms, and current trends in treatment are reviewed. Case studies highlight important components of patient assessment, diagnosis, and treatment.
CE253	Sexual Assault and Rape: The Nursing Role	The goal of this program is to educate nurses about identifying and caring for victims of rape and sexual assault.
CE505	Shock States: Knowing the Similarities and Differences is Vital	The purpose of this program is to increase nurses' understanding of the five types of shock states, including risk factors, pathophysiology, signs and symptoms and treatment.
CE537	Spinal Cord Injury (Rehabilitation and Beyond) (Part 2)	The purpose of this program is to provide nurses with information about spinal cord injury rehabilitation and the management of chronic spinal cord injury.
CE536	Spinal Cord Injury: The Acute Phase	The goal of this program is to provide nurses with information about the acute phase of spinal cord injury.
CE339	The Organ Donation Choice: What Every Nurse Needs to Know	The goal of this program is to provide information about current organ donation issues.
CE571	Traumatic Brain Injury	The goal of this program is to provide nurses with information about traumatic brain injuries, including epidemiology, types of injuries, signs and symptoms, and nursing assessment, interventions, and evaluation.
CE205	Uncovering Abuse in the Pregnant Woman	The goal of this program is to update healthcare professionals' ability to recognize, evaluate, and intervene with women who experience abuse during pregnancy.
60024	Violence and Families	The goal of this program is to provide nurses with an understanding of family violence and its impact on family members and the family social structure.
60044	Weapons of Mass Destruction	The goal of this course is to provide nurses with information about the medical consequences of an act of terrorism that involve weapons of mass destruction.
CE471	What's on the Inside	The goal of this program is to provide nurses with an understanding of the pathophysiology of injuries related to blunt chest trauma, and to promote awareness of the methods used in assessing and managing the care of these patients.
